
就讓我們走出去,看看和感受神的作為,靠向祂的心意。

第一站: (至下午2:30) 天滿街 (Tremont St)和橡樹街 (Oak St) 交界

在這個路口,你可以看到低收入高層住宅樓宇公路村和君子樓。你亦可以看到華埠青年會(Wang YMCA)和橙線地鐵站。停下來,留心看看每個進出樓宇的人,或是那些擦身而過的途人,為他們祈禱。同時也為你自己禱告,求神給你愛人的心去服事他們,明白如何有效地傳福音。

神能照著運行在我們心裡的大力充充足足的成就一切,超過我們所求所想的。 但願他在教會中,並在基督耶穌裡,得著榮耀 ,直到世世代代,永永遠遠。阿們! (以弗所書 3:20-21)

第二站:所勿街 (Shawmut Ave.) 120 號


第三站:羅馬天主教聖三一堂

1 @ Shawmut Ave. & E. Berkeley St. 堡壘村 - 天滿街 436-480 號

堡壘村由 500 個中低層家庭單位組成。 根據 2010 年美國人口普查的數字, 超過 百分之七十五的居民為亞裔。該處亦有 幾家小型商戶。

- 求主賜我們一顆關心堡壘村住戶的心 (其中有住戶是我們教會的肢體);
- 禱告我們有機會以基督的愛去關懷及 服事他們, 並有效地向他們作見證。

2 @ Washington & William E Mullins Way 超市: 平價和中國超市

座落在華盛頓街的兩大間華人超市,是 亞裔和其他族裔顧客每周聚集購物的地 方。

- 為長時間工作的收銀、肉販、店員、 搬運工人和他們的家人禱告;
- 祈求神差遣更多工人, 帶著道成肉身 的異象, 去到他們當中收割這禾場。

3 @ Washington & Pine Street

學校: 昆士小學 (QES) 和昆士中學 (QUS) 我們許多人都對昆士小學熟識,我們現 有兩堂崇拜在這裡舉行。 周間,除了教 育下一代外,它亦是服務大波士頓移民 的社會服務機構和診所之所在地。 昆士 中學是一間試點學校,服事六至十二年 級的學生。

- 為不同種族和經濟階層的居民能和諧 共存禱告,也為教會能將福音帶給他 們禱告。





<u>Station #1</u> ~ (closes at 2:30pm) Corner of Tremont & Oak Streets



At this street corner, you will see the low-income residential high-rise buildings Mass Pike & Quincy Towers. You will also see the Wang YMCA, and the Orange Line T stop. Look and see the people coming in/out of these places.

As you walk towards the end of the block, have a short prayer for the people you see. Pray for yourself to have God's heart for the people in the community and how to effectively reach out to them.

Station #2 ~ 120 Shawmut Avenue



As of April 2014, we are officially the owner of 120 Shawmut Ave. The facility is a 3-story building with a commercial kitchen, lots of offices, classrooms, outdoor patio, and more.

What do you envision in these spaces? Take a pen and sticky note and jot down what comes to mind and stick it on the huge post-it in the lobby area.


Station #3 ~ Holy Trinity Church

Through this prayer walk, we will seek God's guidance, mercy and transforming power — both for the community, and for ourselves as God's servants in the community.

1 @ Shawmut Ave. & E. Berkeley St. Castle Square Apartment Complex – 436-480 Tremont Street

The Castle Square Apartment complex is comprised of 500 single-unit apartments for low and moderate income families. According to the US Census in 2010, over 75% of the residents are Asian. It also houses several small businesses.

- Pray for the desire to care about the Castle Square tenants (some are already part of our BCEC community);
- Pray for opportunities to care, connect, serve and effectively witness to them with the love of Christ.

2 @ Washington St.& William E Mullins Way Supermarkets: Ming's and C-Mart

The two larger Chinese supermarkets on Washington Street are the gathering places for Asian and other ethnicities shoppers throughout the week.

- Pray for the cashiers, butchers, stock guys, delivery men, who work labor intensive hours and their families;
- Pray for more workers with an incarnational ministry vision to reach this harvest field.

3 @ Washington St. & Pine St.

Schools: Quincy Elementary School (QES) and Quincy Upper School (QUS)

Many of us are familiar with Quincy Elementary School, where two BCEC Sunday services are held. On the weekdays, besides educating the next generation, it also houses social services and a health clinic which serves many immigrants across Greater Boston. QUS is a pilot school that serves students from 6th to 12th grades.

 Pray for God to restore lives in the schools, change the children, remake the men, redeem the women, transform our community so thoroughly that joy comes pouring out of our windows and doors.

4 @ Front door of 249 Harrison Ave.

Chinatown residents: You will see 4 types of residences in Chinatown: Tai Tung Village (affordable), Oak Terrace and Metropolitan (mixed-income), brick tenements (mostly familyowned apartments), Ink Block (luxury).

 Pray for harmony and community for the racially and socio-economically diverse residents, and for the church to reach out to them.
